1 Public forum

A parishioner asked for a new dog poo bin on Coltishall Lane. Cllr Oakes said this was to be done soon. She also enquired about TPC's asset register and how assets would be split off to the village hall when it becomes a CIO.

TPC feel that one solution would be to charge a nominal rent on the land that has been fenced in but that the land remains the property of TPC. However, once the fence requires replacing, the fence will revert to the correct position.

Cllr Place said that Victory Housing are willing to sort this problem out.

Cllr Foulds had contacted the Clerk by e-mail to say that she knew one person interested in becoming a Tunstead parish councillor.
